World Book Day – Thursday 6th March

A reminder that World Book Day is next Thursday, 6th March. We have an action-packed day planned, with the aim of fostering and nurturing our children's love of reading. In addition to the activities and events in school, we are also launching a KS1 competition – Create a Magic Medicine - and a KS2 competition – Create a Wonka Chocolate Bar. These are addition to a 'Best Dressed Book Character' in each year group

Why do we have World Book Day? The world may be rapidly changing, but reading has never been so important. The correlation between children who read at home for at least 20 minutes per evening and increased life chances is incredibly strong, perhaps more than any other single factor. It doesn't just impact on their academic progress and attainment (across the entire curriculum, not just in English), but is also proven to improve children's wellbeing, social and emotional skills, future work opportunities, health and even life expectancy. Whether or not a child reads for pleasure when they are young is a larger indicator of future success than even their postcode or their parents' occupation. It really is so important. This is why we have World Book Day, and also why at Debden we place such a huge emphasis on reading in general.
