Second Lieutenant Walter Tull

26th April 1888 – 25th March 1918

He was the first British-born black army officer and the first black officer to lead white British troops into battle.



When he was ten he was orphaned and sent to a Methodist orphanage in Bethnal Green. Here Walter played for the orphanage football team.



In 1909 he signed as a professional for Tottenham Hotspur. While playing Bristol City he experienced specialist racism for the first time.



In 2018 Royal Mail created a set of stamps to mark the centenary of the end of the First World War. One of these featured Second Lieutenant Walter Tull.

When the First World War broke out he was the first Northampton player to sign up to join the 13th (1st Football) Battalion of the Middlesex Regiment and in November 1915 his battalion was deployed to France. His leadership qualities were soon recognised and he was promoted to the rank of sergeant. In December 1916 he developed trench fever and was sent home to England, where he recovered he was sent to the officers training school at Sandhurst, Scotland. Despite military regulations forbidding any black person being an officer, Tull received his commission in May, 1917. He was then sent to the Italian front where he led his men at the Battle of Fosse. On 25th March 1918 he was ordered to lead his men on an attack on the German trenches at Farnoul. Soon after entering No Man's Land, 1st Lieutenant Walter Tull was hit by a German bullet and died. He was only 29.

Walter is remembered on the Aras Memorial in France. The Aras Memorial commemorates 33,362 soldiers with no known grave who died in the Aras sector between the spring of 1916 and 1st August 1918.

Through his actions W.G. Tull indicated the barriers of ignorance that tried to deny the people of colour equality with their counterparts. His life stands testament to a determination to confront these people and those obstacles that sought to diminish him and the world to which he lived. It recalls a man, though restricted physically in his arms, whose strong heart still beats loudly. This memorial marks an area of reflected space as a gesture of remembrance.

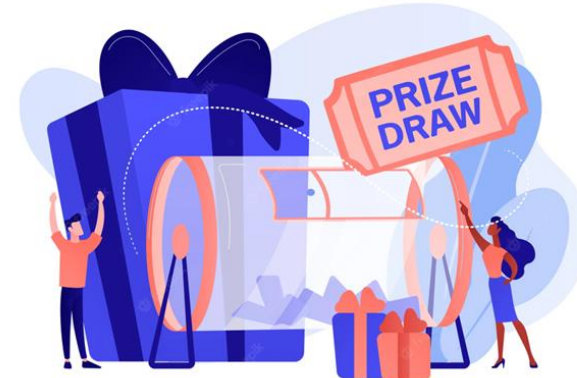

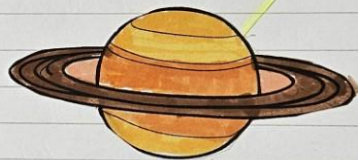


The Earth is the third planet away from the sun.

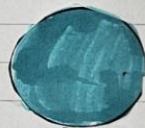
Mars is the nearest planet to earth after Venus.



Jupiter is the biggest planet in the Solar System - twice as heavy as all the other planets put together.



Saturn is the second biggest planet in the solar system - 817 times as big in volume as the Earth.



Uranus is the seventh planet out from the Sun. Its orbit keeps it 178 million km away.



Neptune is the eighth planet out from the Sun, varying in distance from 4456 to 5337 million km.

Mercury

Mercury is the closest planet to the sun. It is also the smallest planet and has years made up of 88 days.



Earth

Earth is the planet that we live on. It is the 3rd planet from the sun.



Venus

Venus is the 2nd planet from the sun. It is a burnt yellow due to the clouds of sulphuric acid. It is known as Earth's twin as it is similar in shape and size.

Saturn is the 6th planet from the sun and has rings made of ice and dust. It is the second biggest planet.

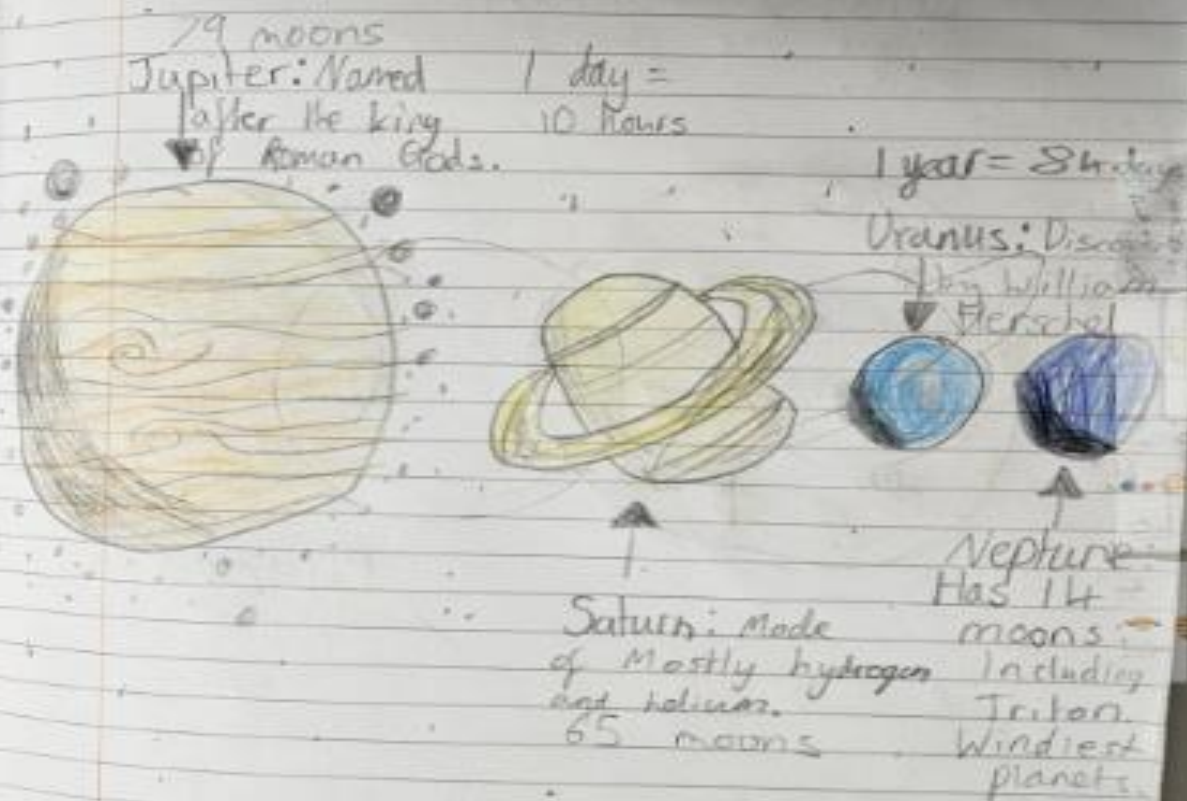
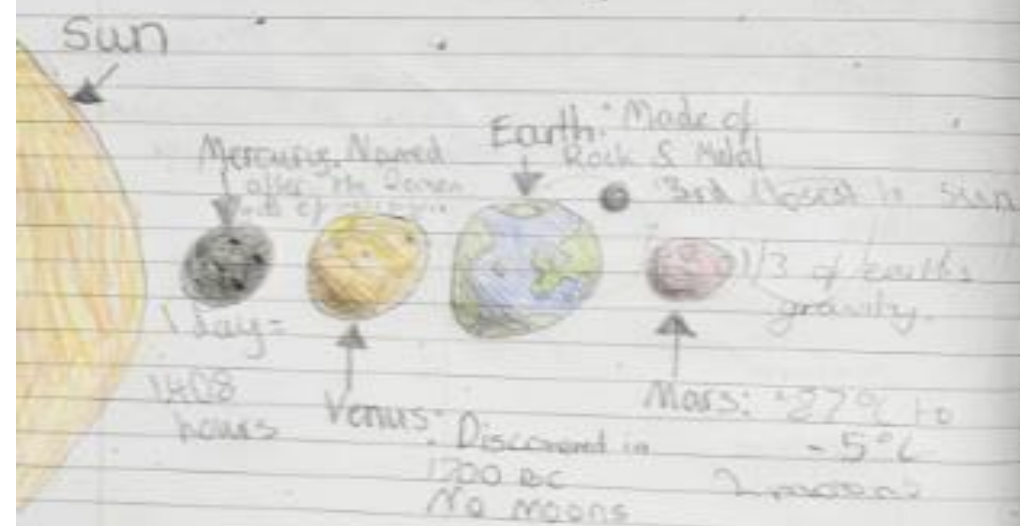


Neptune
